

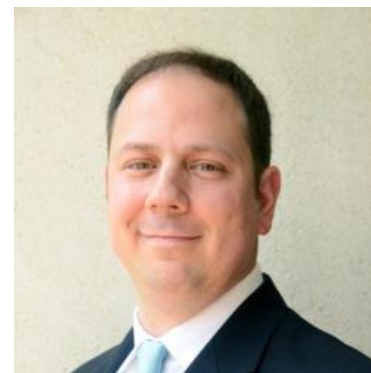
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The Day Ahead: Barely Weaker After Weekly ADP Data (Not Retail Sales)

Retail Sales definitely garnered a higher volume reaction, but it was balanced between buyers and sellers whereas ADP actually caused a small directional move.
